American Cancer Society Making Strides Against Breast Cancer Walk is Saturday, October 21, 2017

Vero Beach, Florida – The American Cancer Society Making Strides Against Breast Cancer walk presented by Florida Cancer Specialists and Florida Health Care Specialist will be held **Saturday**, **October 21**, **2017** at **Riverside Park**, and will unite the community with a shared determination to help create a world free from the pain and suffering caused by breast cancer. Registration begins at **7:00am**, inspirational program at **8:00am** and the noncompetitive walk is set to start at **9:00am**.

Dollars raised by Making Strides supporters help the American Cancer Society ensure no one faces breast cancer alone by funding innovative breast cancer research; promoting education and risk reduction; and providing comprehensive patient support to those who need it most.

Since 1993, more than 12 million supporters have raised more than \$750 million nationwide. Last year, nearly 3,000 Making Strides Against Breast Cancer participants raised \$120,000 in Indian River County for the American Cancer Society to invest in groundbreaking research; provide free, comprehensive information and support to those touched by breast cancer; and help people take steps to reduce their breast cancer risk or find it early when it's most treatable.

According to the American Cancer Society Cancer Facts & Figures 2017, an estimated 252,710 women in the United States will be diagnosed with breast cancer and an estimated 40,610 will die from the disease this year. Additionally, more than 2,400 cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed in men, and 460 will die. In Indian River County, 16 men have committed to bring awareness to male breast cancer and raise funds for breast cancer research and services through the Real Men Wear Pink initiative. In Florida 18,170 women will be diagnosed this year and 2,910 will die from the disease. Breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death in women, and it is the most common cancer diagnosed in women other than skin cancer.

"Because of the determination of Making Strides supporters, the American Cancer Society is there for people in every community affected by breast cancer, whether they're currently dealing with a diagnosis, may face one in the future, or will avoid it altogether because of education and risk reduction," said Dr. Daniel Glotzer, Making Strides Against Breast Cancer 2017 Event Chair. From research to education, prevention to diagnosis, and treatment to recovery, we provide support to everyone impacted by breast cancer."
